Title: The Unconquerable King

**Scripture Text: Revelation 1:9-19** 

As stated last week, Revelation means unveiling, which is the premise of the entire book of Revelation as God reveals Himself to John through multiple visions. In today's passage John is going to see the glory of Jesus unveiled, therefore giving us a glimpse at *The Unconquerable King*!

## I. The Explanation of a Divine Encounter (Revelation 1:9-11)

John gives further background details about the vision he received from God of the glorified Christ. John presents information regarding 1) the person (himself), 2) the place (his location), 3) the practice (his worship), and 4) the plan (his commission).

- What are some ways or times you have felt "exiled"?
- What are some ways you have encountered God during suffering or hardship?
- How can we use the truth God gives us during difficulties to encourage others?

### II. The Description of the King (Revelation 1:12-16)

In these verses John sees a vision of the glorified Christ! John gives several descriptive qualities of Jesus showing His deity and portraying Him as *The Unconquerable King*!

- What description of Jesus in these verses stands out to you the most?
   Why?
- How does having a clearer understanding of Jesus impact our lives?
- When facing trials and difficulties, how can this passage about Jesus be a source of encouragement and inspiration?

### III. The Declaration of the King (Revelation 1:17-19)

After seeing the exalted Christ, John falls to the ground, but Jesus comes to John and gives him a declaration.

- What keeps us from humbling ourselves before Jesus, like John in Revelation 1:17?
- How do the words of Christ in <u>Revelation 1:17-18</u>, prove that He is *The Unconquerable King*?
- What can we do this week to show those around us that our faith is not in our current circumstances, but in Jesus, *The Unconquerable King*?
